Instead, **build an 'inland settlement** ... on the bank of a river which flow[s] ... into the sea ... with [a] smooth and unfailing ... broad stream'.

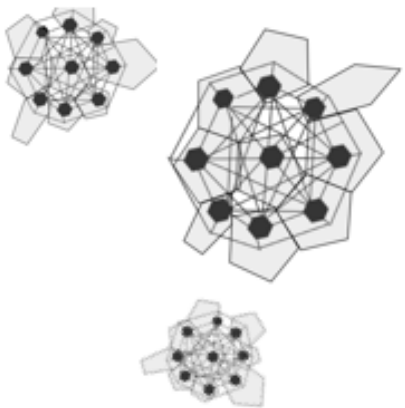
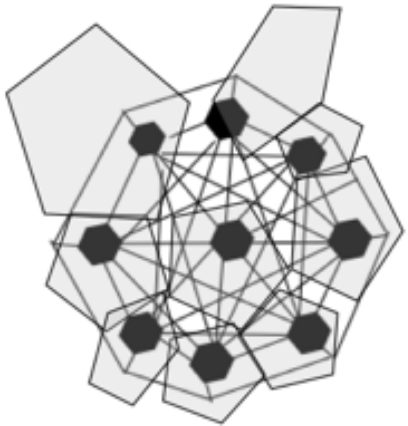
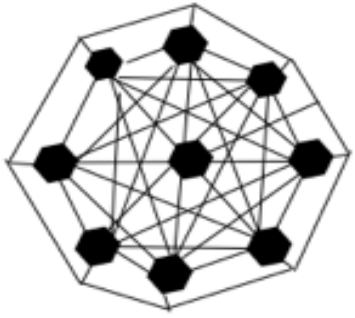
ideally, 'the line and course of [the] wall [would] run in every direction through steep precipitous mountains'

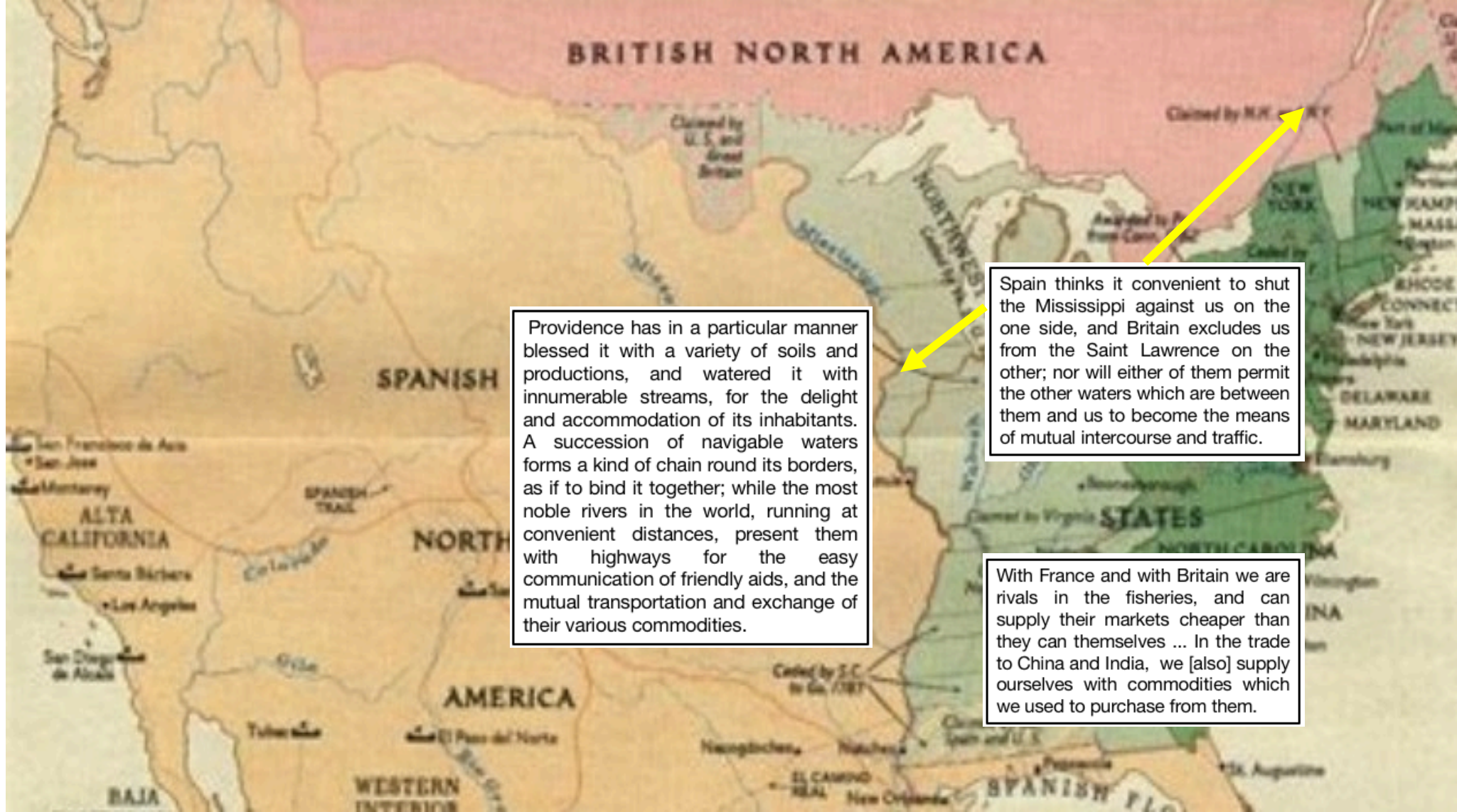
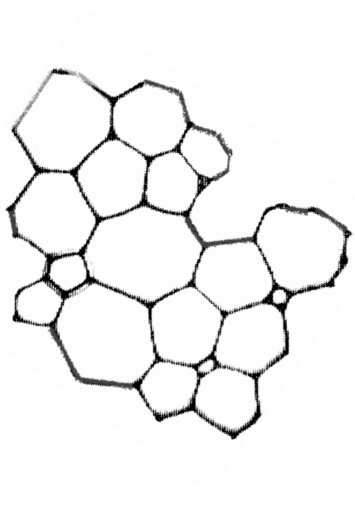
'If the soil is barren and unproductive, or the land too crowded for its inhabitants, the people should turn to industry and the crafts, and exchange what they produce for the commodities they lack. 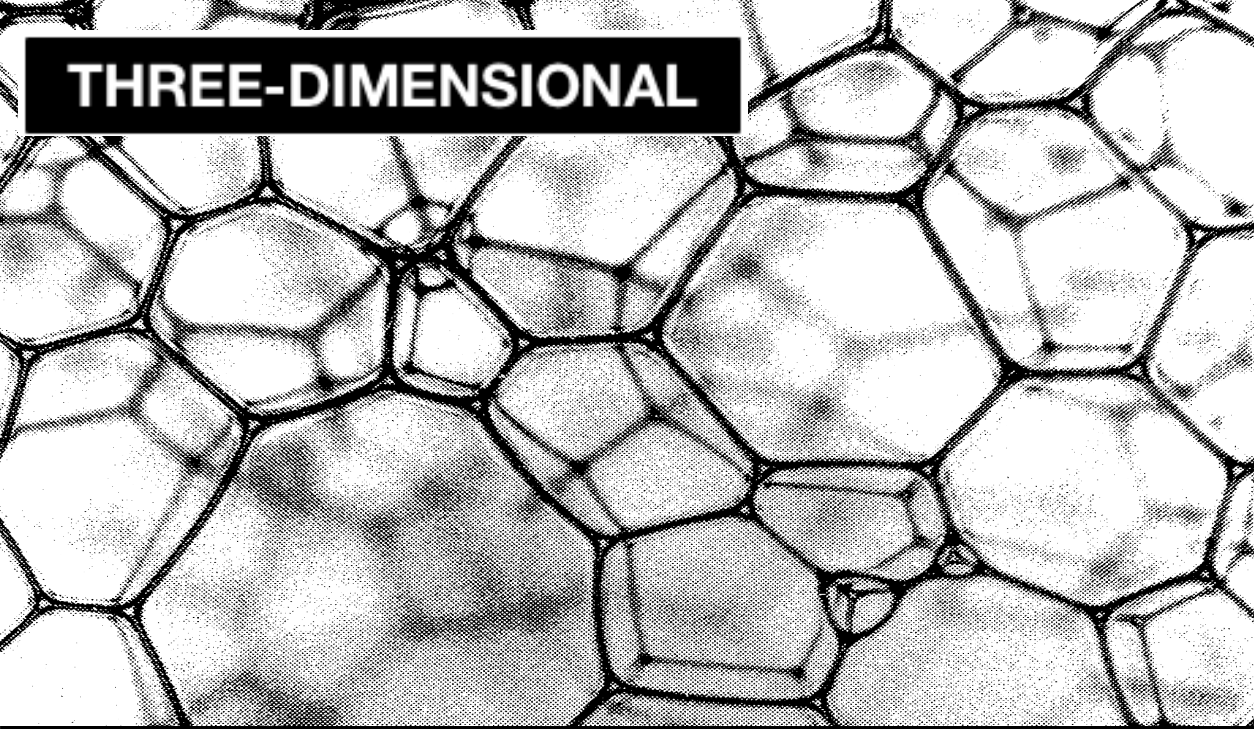




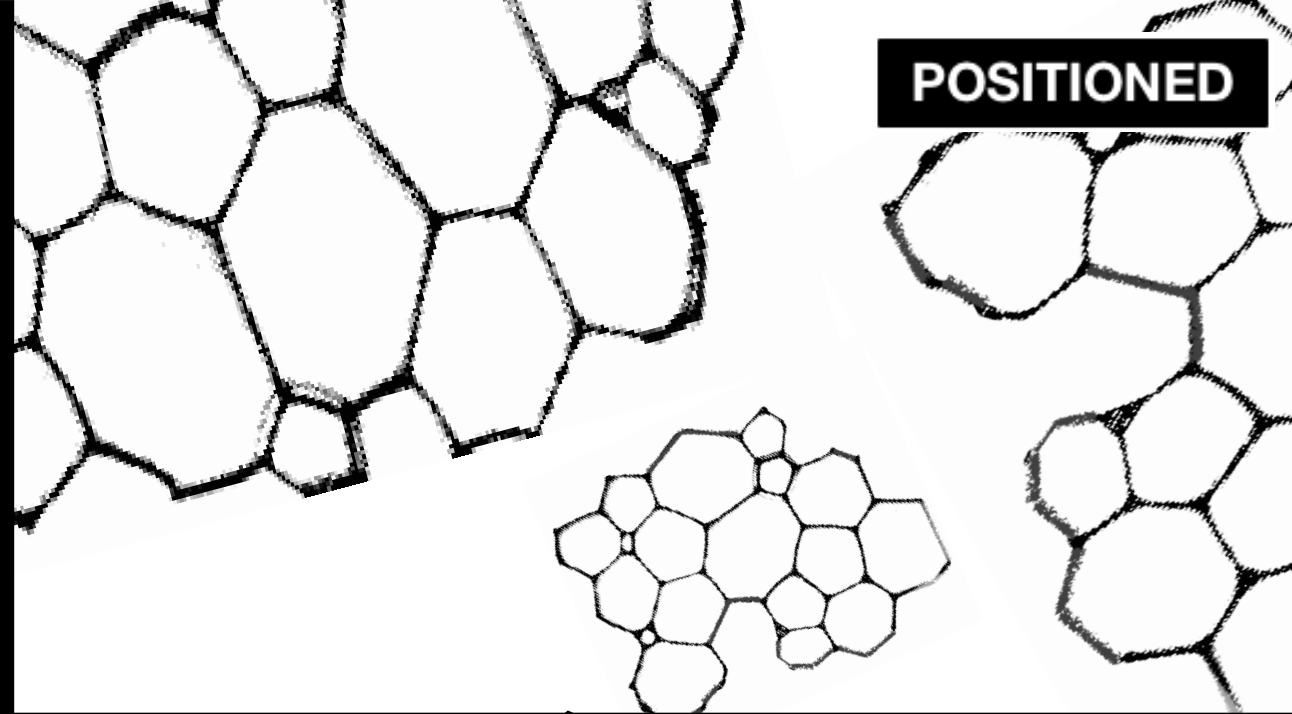

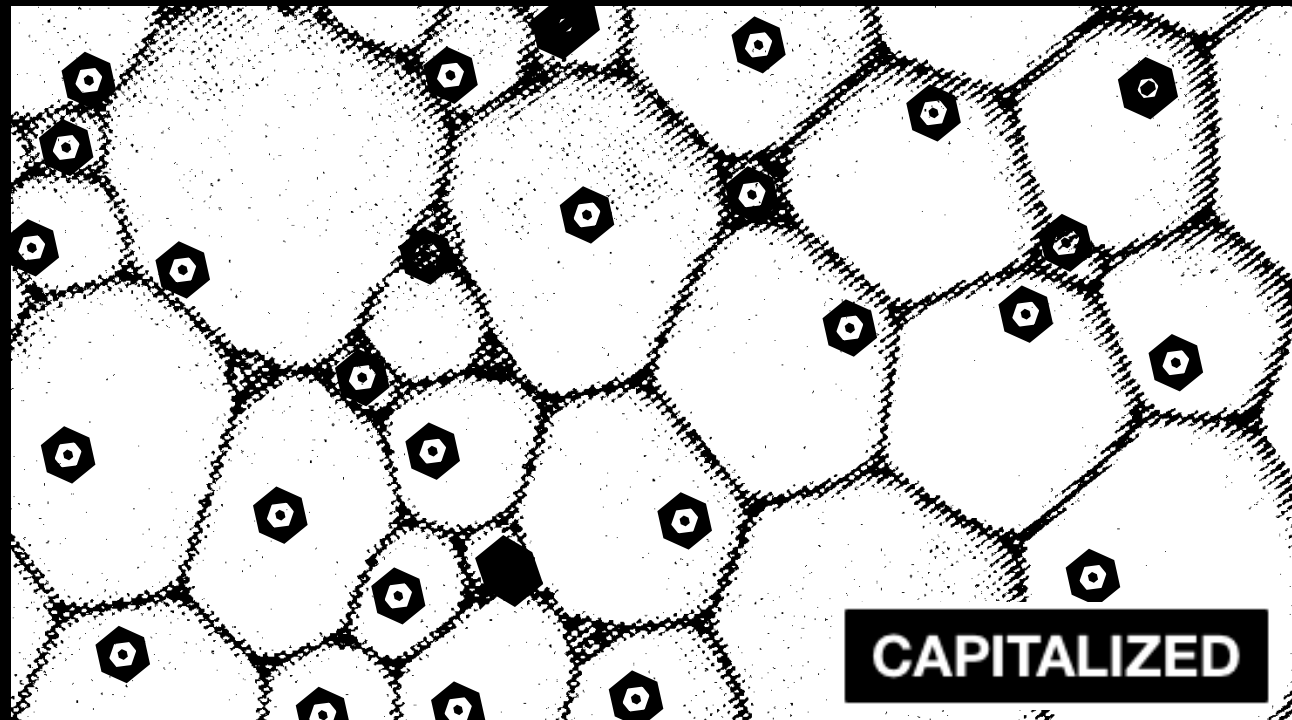

[S]ince the earth is a globe', [t]he geometrical form of the space of the State [must] approximately [be that of an] inverted cone, [with] vertex ... in the center of the earth where the conic spaces, the so-called territories of all the states, meet. What traditional theory defines as 'territory of the State,'... is only a visible plane formed by a transverse section of the State's conic space ... [with] the space above and below [that plane]... belong[ing] legally to the state as far as its coercive power, extends.
